



- PP measures for overall absence, persistent absences, severe persistent absence and unauthorised absence are all in the top quartile

#### OHSL club attendance

57% of our PP cohort are signed up for at least 1 after school club (sept 2024) . This figure is up 3% from last year.

Suspensions have reduced for PP pupils over the last three years, and the gap is also reducing.

FFT Lab data shows that 12% of DP pupils in Year 7 were suspended once a more in 23/24. DP pupils at MBMS have a positive 3 year trend of being suspended less than their national counterparts.
